OEOBENTOE – OUR NEWLY APPROVED CHARITY PROJECT IN SOUTH AFRICA

Oeboentoe has for the past thirteen years been offering a safe, loving shelter to neglected and traumatized children between the ages of 0 and 13. The house parents, Cawood and Erica Kelbrick and their four children form the framework around which several welfare organizations and the Child Protection Units of the SAPS place children out for undefined periods of time.

Here the children are not only physically cared for but also spiritually and emotionally supported by the house parents, assisted by several supporters that are involved on a regular basis. They are also protected against further exposure to physical, sexual and emotional abuse and neglect, until the Juvenile court's investigation is completed. Oeboentoe House has given a home and care to approximately 145 children over the past thirteen years, sometimes under very difficult circumstances. Why the name Oeboentoe? Cawood and Erica made themselves available and the children started streaming in. They sometimes wondered how they would be able to help and love all the children that ended up in their home. They realized that the answer lay in more ways than one in "Oë -boontoe" (Eyes heavenwards). Since then the family has not looked down.

„FAMILY STRENGTHENING PROGRAMS“ PROJECT – SOUTH AFRICA

Auch in diesem Jahr wird FoSA „Family strengthening programs“ in SA unterstützen. Diese Initiativen gehen von den SOS-Kinderdörfern in SA aus und werden in enger Zusammenarbeit mit den jeweiligen Gemeinden durchgeführt. Familien, die durch AIDS dezimiert wurden und wo vor allem die Eltern fehlen, erhalten Hilfe auf verschiedenste Weise. Meistens betreut nur noch eine Großmutter oder das Älteste der Geschwister die Kinder.

Die Unterstützung wird in Form von Essenspaketen, Kleidung, Schuluniformen, Schulgeld, Gesundheitsbetreuung und Freizeitmöglichkeiten gewährt. Es wird dafür gesorgt, dass die Kinder sicher zum Wasserholen gehen können. Oft sind die Alten in der Familie selbst hilfsbedürftig, daher besuchen Freiwillige regelmäßig die Familien, damit sie auch ein wenig Liebe und Zuwendung bekommen. Ziel ist, die Familien in ihren Häuschen zu erhalten und nicht in Institutionen zu überführen. Zusätzlich gibt es Anleitung zum eigenen Gelderwerb, wie das Erlernen von

Handarbeiten und Anbau von Gemüse und Obst. In diesem Jahr 2008 unterstützen wir das Projekt in Kapstadt.

COOKING CORNER.....

LEMON MERINGUE PIE

397 g tin Sweetened Condensed Milk
125 ml lemon Juice (1/2 cup)
Grated rind of 1 Lemon
2 Eggs, separated
25 ml Granulated Sugar (2 teaspoons)
1 ml Salt

METHOD

1. mix together sweetened condensed milk, lemon juice, grated rind of lemon, egg yolks and the salt.
2. pour into a 20 cm baked pie shell.

3. cover with meringue made by beating the egg whites until they are stiff and dry, then gradually add the sugar and beat again.
4. bake in a slow oven (140-150 deg C) for 30 minutes, or until the meringue is crisp and golden brown

JOHAN BOTHA**

SA TENOR DETHRONES DOMINGO

South African tenor Johan Botha has triumphed at New York's Metropolitan Opera and dethroned Placido Domingo as the world's new Otello.

New York - It's no small task for a tenor to take on a role that Placido Domingo dominated for decades - Verdi's Otello. But the **South African tenor Johan Botha** triumphed on Monday at the Metropolitan Opera in New York, where Domingo sang 40 performances of the Shakespearean tragedy that Verdi turned into towering musical drama.

The Met audience awarded the South African star with a standing ovation for his portrayal of the complex Otello. Otello's self-destructive love journey is one of the most riveting in opera, and one of the most technically taxing. The role demands a combination of Wagnerian heft, Italianate lyricism and volcanic rage that few singers possess. The 42-year-old Botha poured his powerful yet sweet sound into the part of the jealous Moor of Venice.

His clarion tenor exuded both passion and stamina, with blowtorch high notes like the high C Otello uses to castigate the wife he believes is unfaithful. Botha's shattering portrayal of Otello was matched by the near-perfect Desdemona of leading American soprano Renee Fleming, who brought a ravishing purity to the role of the wife humiliated and literally strangled by her husband's blind obsession.....
